Guidelines for Senior Photos:

1. Senior photos must be a professional looking photo. Photos taken with a cell phone/webcam **will not** be accepted.
2. Senior photos can be taken by **Melino Photo** (our official school photographer) **OR** a professional photographer of your choice. *Appointments made through Melino-Photo: (www.melino-photo.com) will help to defray the cost of the overall yearbook. Please contact Melino Photo (401-738-6614) regarding promotions or discounted rates available.*
3. Seniors **may NOT** substitute their School ID photos as their Senior Portrait.

Submission Guidelines for Senior Photos:

PLEASE NOTE: If you are getting your photos through Melino Photo you do not need to submit a photo. They will do this for you! 😊

1. Senior photos must be submitted as a **(.jpg) format**.
2. Senior photos must be submitted in **high resolution (300ppi)**
3. Senior photos must be **between 500KB and 5MB** (file size)
4. Senior photos may be submitted via:
