Community: South Kingstown High School is located on the Atlantic Coast, 32 miles south of Providence, Rhode Island, in the village of Wakefield. The town covers an area of 63 square miles with a population of 30,700. The main campus of the University of Rhode Island is within five miles of South Kingstown High School.

Student Enrollment: As of September 2017, there were 924 students enrolled in the following grades: 9th – 243; 10th- 236; 11th – 228; and 12th-211

Faculty: The professional staff includes 86 full and part-time classroom teachers, 4 school counselors, 1.6 school psychologists, 1 library media specialist, 2 deans and 1 each: speech and language therapist, social worker and school resource officer. Additionally there are department chairs in the area of Applied Learning, English, World Language, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Health/Physical Education, Special Education, Fine Arts and Guidance. The administrative staff consists of 1 principal, 2 assistant principals and an athletic director (K-12).

Extra-Curricular: Although emphasis is placed on a challenging academic program, it is recognized that a well-rounded activity program is an important complement to these academics. Twenty three interscholastic sports, as well as in an intramural program and organized activities which include clubs, service organizations, and literary groups are available to our students.
